



### CoSMO

There are 16 ministries called CoSMO (Community Service and Ministry Opportunities). The average participation per week for all of these is approximately 238 students.

### Mandate

Mandate is a student-led, inner-city service ministry. A group of approximately 25 students go several times a semester on weekend or fall/January term breaks to serve in such cities as Cincinnati, Columbus, Cleveland, and Pittsburgh.

### Small Group Ministries

There are three categories of Small Group Ministries with several groups in each category. The number of groups in each category is as follows: Freshmen & Transfer (53), Upperclassmen (50), and Faculty/Staff (20).
